
The aim of the Act is to provide sound fiscal risk management, fiscal and debt sustainability, transparency in government finance statistics through various annual and semi-annual reporting.

# **GLOSSARY**

AFD	The French Development Agency (French: Agence franchise de development, AFD) is a public financial institution that implements the policy defined by the French Government.
ATM	A measure of weighted average time to maturity of all principal repayments in the portfolio. ATM measures the average length of time it takes for all debt instruments to mature. A longer ATM implies lower refinancing risk and vice versa.
ATR	A measure of weighted average time until all principal repayments in the portfolio become subject to a new interest rate. The longer the period, the longer the interest exposure.
Capitalization of Interest	Interest charged but no paid becomes part of the loan principal amount. It increases the amount of loan.
Debt to Revenue	The ratio of outstanding debt to Revenue measure the burden of debt on the Provincial Revenues.
Disbursed and Outstanding	Disbursed and Outstanding: Total amount which has been disbursed and which is due to be repaid.
Disbursements	Resources, such as goods, services, or funds, taken by the borrower against a debt agreement
DM	The deutschemark (or "D-mark") was the official currency of the Federal Republic of Germany until 2002. #### 1: INTRODUCTION

As of 30th June 2022, the Disbursed and Outstanding Foreign liability of 106 external loans represents a volume of PKR 359,330¹ million (at USD/PKR rate of 186)² vis-a¹-vis Rs. 294,097 million as on 30th June 2021.

There is no domestic debt liability on the KP province as domestic loans are relatively more expensive than the foreign loans, foreign loans has an historical currency depreciation of around 7% plus an average interest of around 2%, hence foreign loan on average cost around 9%³ whereas domestic loans are charged at KIBOR plus a spread, the prevailing KIBOR as on 30th June 2022 was 15.35% hence with a spread of 2%, the domestic loans interest cost around 17-18%. Moreover, the tenor of the domestic loans is significantly lower than that of foreign loans; normally domestic loans are extended for a period of 5-10 years whereas the tenor of foreign loans ranges from 25-30 Years including grace period of 5-7 years.

During the current Financial Year 2021-22, the Government of KP has repaid Rs. 12,910 million on account of Principal and paid Interest of Rs. 2,444 million.

The ratio of outstanding debt as a percentage of total receipts of the province is only 45.1%, whereas the ratio of debt servicing to total receipts is merely 1.9%. These ratios shows that debt portfolio of the province is in a stable position. However, the ratio of Outstanding Debt to KP's Budget FY 2021-22 is merely 32%, in comparison to the Punjab Government which is hovering at 45% and for Government of Sindh, it is 41%.

Whereas KP's Total Revenues are taken as a sum of Federal Tax assignment, Straight transfer (Royalties on oil and gas), Net Hydel Profits (NHP) and KP Own Sources of Receipts (Tax and non-Tax) and Grants from Federal Govt. (NMAs). The KP Total Revenues excludes money received in the form of Loans and Grants.

KP Government has raised Long-term concessional loans for development projects and programs. The tenor of these loans ranges from 20 to 25 years, with grace periods of 5 to 10 years,

Interest rate on fixed rate loans ranges from 0.75% to 2% per annum whereas the interest rate on floating rate loans is linked to a reference rate such as LIBOR plus a fixed spread of 50 basis points (bps). The principal repayment is spread over the repayment period after the grace period is passed.

While the debt service, including commitment fees, interest and principal repayment is borne by the provincial government's budget through deduction from the monthly revenue share, received from the federal government.

These foreign loans are negotiated via federal government - through the Ministry of Economic Affairs, Islamabad, (previously Economic Affairs Division), acting as sovereign borrower and then on-lent to provinces on the same terms and conditions, the most important implication of this arrangement is that the provincial government accepts the full exposure to exchange rates fluctuations during its debt service. It is, however, not a duty of the provincial government to ensure availability of foreign exchange to meet the debt obligations of foreign lenders.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> The outstanding debt liability of the KP province as of 30th June is Rs. 359,330 million at exchange rate of USD to PKR of 186, however at the actual conversion rate on 30th June 2022 was 204.75, at which the total debt liability of the province is Rs. 395,553 million.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>3</sup> The exchange rate depreciation of PKR against other foreign currencies has been historically an average 7% and markup on foreign concessional loans is 2%, hence the total cost of foreign loans is around 9%, which is far lower compared to borrowings from domestic financial market. Currently, the cost of domestic borrowing is around 18% p.a.

The total increase in debt stock during the year is 22.14%, it is attributable to two factors

- :I. The foreign exchange parity of PKR against multiple currencies ws 13.07%,
- ii. Whereas 9% is the net disbursements (Total disbursements less Principal repayments) during the year.










#### **Disbursement in Active Loans 30th June 2022**





#### **Active Loans Disbursements Status - 30th June 2022**





#### 13: REDEMPTION PROFILE








